

## Key Facts to Learn - Spring 1

## I can recall facts about measures and money.

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts **instantly**.

Children also need to be aware of all the different coins and notes and their value.

## Top Tips

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

<u>Use measures in and around the home</u> - Children really enjoy taking a tape measure and measuring things around the house or gardent. Use the scales when weighing and thinking about capacity using jugs and water.

<u>Use money</u> - Counting the change in a purse or a change pot. Playing shops/exchanging money. Paying for items in a real shop and checking the change. Even playing monopoly or other board games involving money.
