## Year 6 - Spring 2

I can tell the time and use time tables to solve time problems.

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts *instantly*.

Children need to be able to tell the time using a clock with hands and a digital clock. This target can be broken down into several steps.

- I can tell the time to the nearest five minutes.
- I can tell the time using a digital clock
- I can convert digital time to analogue time
- I can answer questions about time duration
- I can read a time table
- Solve time problems

**Example - Time to cook a turkey**  
Cook for 45 min per kg weight  
Then a further 45 min

For a 6 kg turkey, follow the formula:  
 $45\text{min} \times 6 + 45\text{min}$   
 $=270\text{min} + 45\text{min}$   
 $=315\text{min}$   
 $=5\text{h } 15\text{min}$



### Top Tips

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely.

- Practise **Key Facts** while walking to school or during a car journey.
- Have a fact of the day.
- It's really important that your child uses mathematical vocabulary accurately.
