Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<p><b>Be a 3D shape detective.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Remind yourself of 3D shape names with the Shape Song on BBC Bitesize <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zps34wx">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zps34wx</a></li> <li>Go on a shape hunt around your house. What 3D 'solid' shapes can you find? What do you notice about them? How many faces do they have? Do they have a flat face, a curved face or both?</li> <li>Using recycling materials, make a model of your choice. Can you identify any 3D shapes in your model?</li> <li>When you are out for your daily exercise, see how many 3D shapes you can spot in the environment?</li> </ul>	<p><b>Read a little every day.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Read for 5 minutes every day. You will find these in the front of your child's blue and green sound books.</li> <li>Read the story of The Three Little Pigs with an adult. You might like to act it out with your family.</li> </ul>
Weekly Phonics/Spellings Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<p><b>Focus on 'igh', 'oa' and 'oo' this week.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you think of a word using these vowel sounds? Remember, 'oo' can make a long sound as in m-oo-n and a short sound as in b-oo-k.</li> <li>Is the vowel trigraph (3 letters) or digraph (2 letters) at the beginning, in the middle or at the end of your word? Use your phoneme fingers to help you.</li> <li>Think of a <u>short</u>, simple sentence to include your word. Count how many words are in your sentence. Write it down and read it back to check for accuracy.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Apply phonic skills to independent writing.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Talk about the story of The Three Little Pigs, thinking about the beginning, middle and end. Where is the story set? Who are the main characters? What is the story problem? How is the problem resolved?</li> <li>Draw or paint a picture of your favourite part of The Three Little Pigs story. Add labels or captions.</li> <li>Draw a map for the wolf to follow. Label the features on your map.</li> <li>Write some words that rhyme with 'pig'. Are they real or made up words?</li> </ul>
<p><b>Learning Project - to be done throughout the week: <i>Create a story</i></b> (These are things to do through the week...)</p>	
<p><b><u>Learning Outside</u></b> Set yourself or your family a challenge. Plan a scavenger hunt and see how many of the items on your list you can find. Ideas might include find something fluffy/green/spikey/round/straight/something that makes a noise.</p> <p><b><u>Weather Watchers</u></b> Look outside and talk about the weather. What do you notice about Spring? Can you spot anything that is changing? How has it changed and why do you think it's happened?</p>
