Year 2 and P3 lessons



- **Make a fraction wall (use the fraction wall on the PDF on website)**

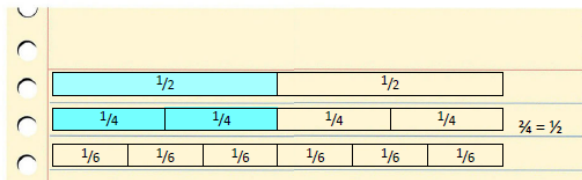
Things you will need:

- A pencil
- A fraction wall
- Coloured pencil
- Scissors
- Glue sticks



What to do:

- Colour in $\frac{1}{2}$ of the strip divided into halves.
- Cut the fraction wall into strips.
- Lay each strip one at a time next to the strip of halves until you find a number of fractions which are the same size as $\frac{1}{2}$. Colour in half of this strip.
- Repeat for each strip until you have found all the fractions which are equivalent (same size) to $\frac{1}{2}$.
- Stick these fractions under one another.
- Write the pairs of equivalent fractions.



S-t-r-e-t-c-h:

Cut another fraction wall into strips. Colour in one quarter of the strips of quarters. Look for fractions equivalent to $\frac{1}{4}$, stick under strips of quarters and write the pairs of equivalent fractions.

Make it your mission to learn two of these each day. Get someone in the house to test you. Continuing with adverbs: This is your next list of adjectives. List 4: Basic, frantic, dramatic, magical, tragic, comical, actual, accidental, occasional, eventual Using the ly suffix, change the adjectives into adverbs. Remember to check your spellings using a dictionary or 'spell check'. Think about what you had to change in order to create your adverb. Now... look at the previous weeks' spelling lists. Look at the sheet 'Adverb-poem-slowly'. Read though the poem by James Reeves. Follow the guidance for your own poem. Start with a spider diagram and add ideas around your chosen adverb. As you write your poem, think about how you could perform it for a chosen audience. Rehearse your performance. Could you teach others in your house to write an 'Adverb Poem' in the same style? Friday night could be 'Performance Night'

This is to create a quiz about the Stone Age. You can write your own questions when you go into the task. Try to do between 8 - 12 questions. As with our previous tasks on Purple Mash, they will appear in the teacher's area so that you can receive 	

feedback on your work. Some of the questions will be used in a quiz for you to complete in a couple of weeks, so make sure that your questions are relevant and interesting.

- We can see that a lot more of you have had a go at the animation set a few weeks ago. Remember - we are unable to comment on it, or upload it onto the display board, until you click 'Hand in work' - it will then show as completed.
- If you would still like to explore Purple Mash, in 'Home' click on Topics and select something from the Stone Age area that interests you. There are several things to choose from. If you save what you do in 'My Work', then we will be able to view it, if you email to let us know it is there.
