Kit and Sam's family were finally called to board the plane. "I'm going to sit next to the window," shouted Sam, waiting in the line.

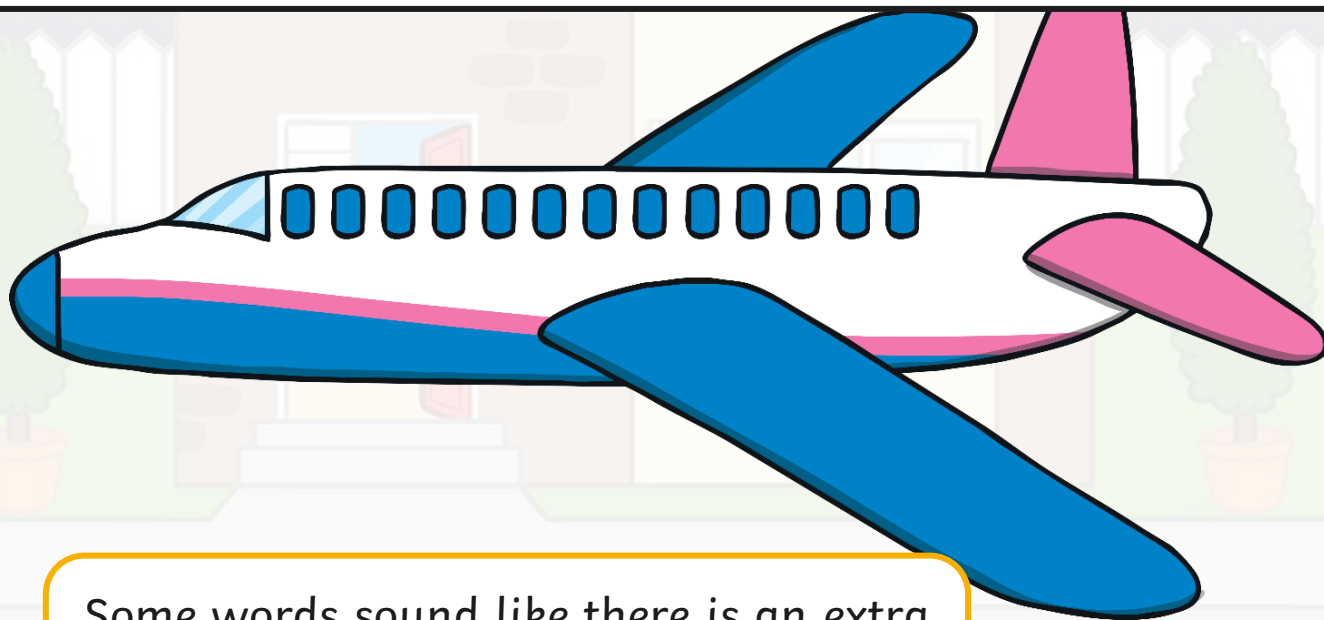


“Oh no, you are not!” said Kit, angrily.

“Enough!” said Dad. “You can swap seats halfway through. That way, you’ll both get to see what’s below.”

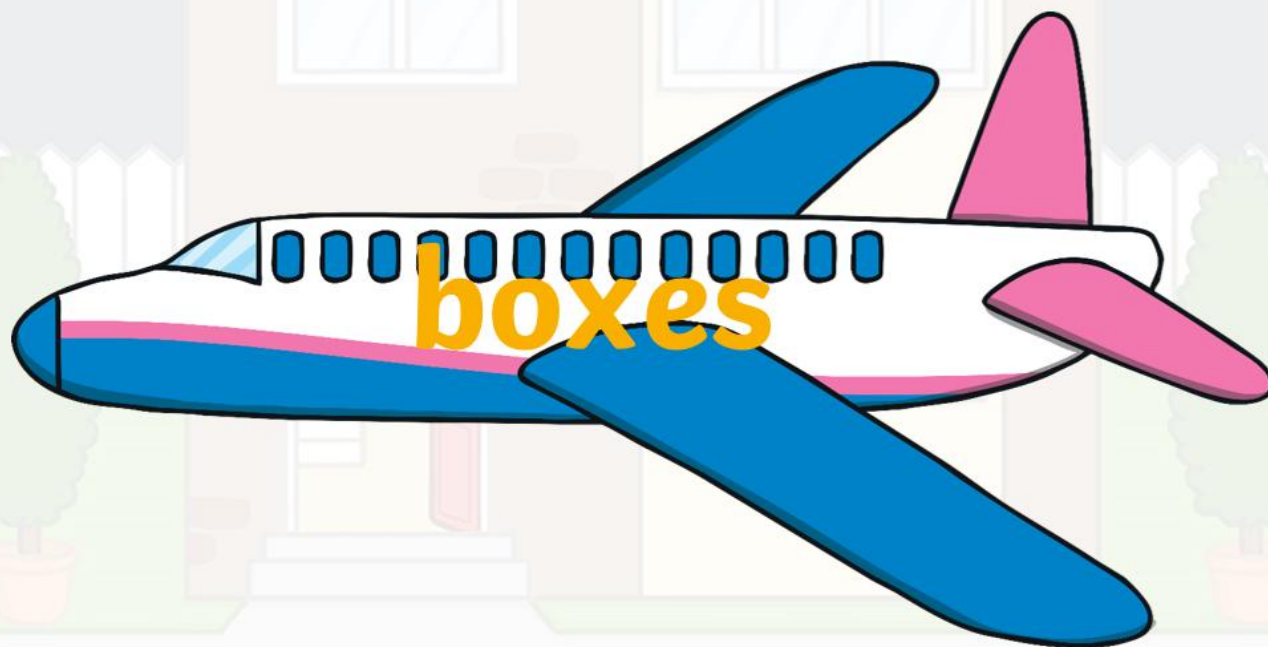
There are lots of other aeroplanes taking off and landing at the airport.

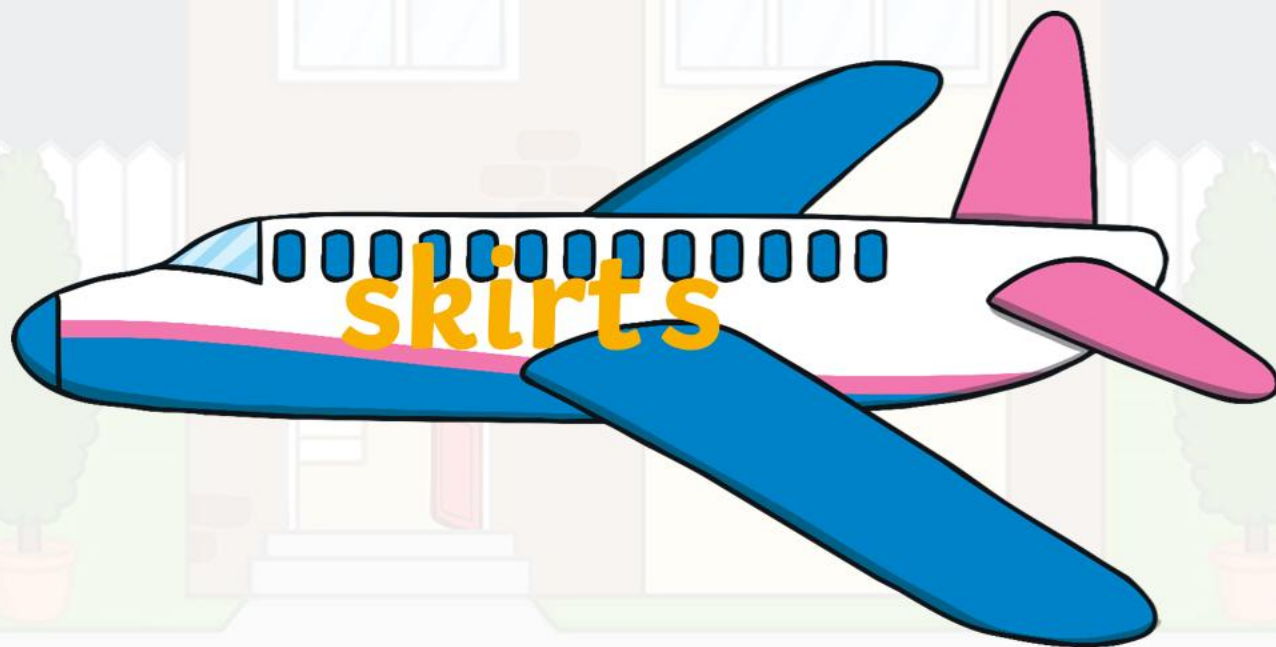
Watch as each plane comes together, then read the **-s** or **-es** word that it makes.

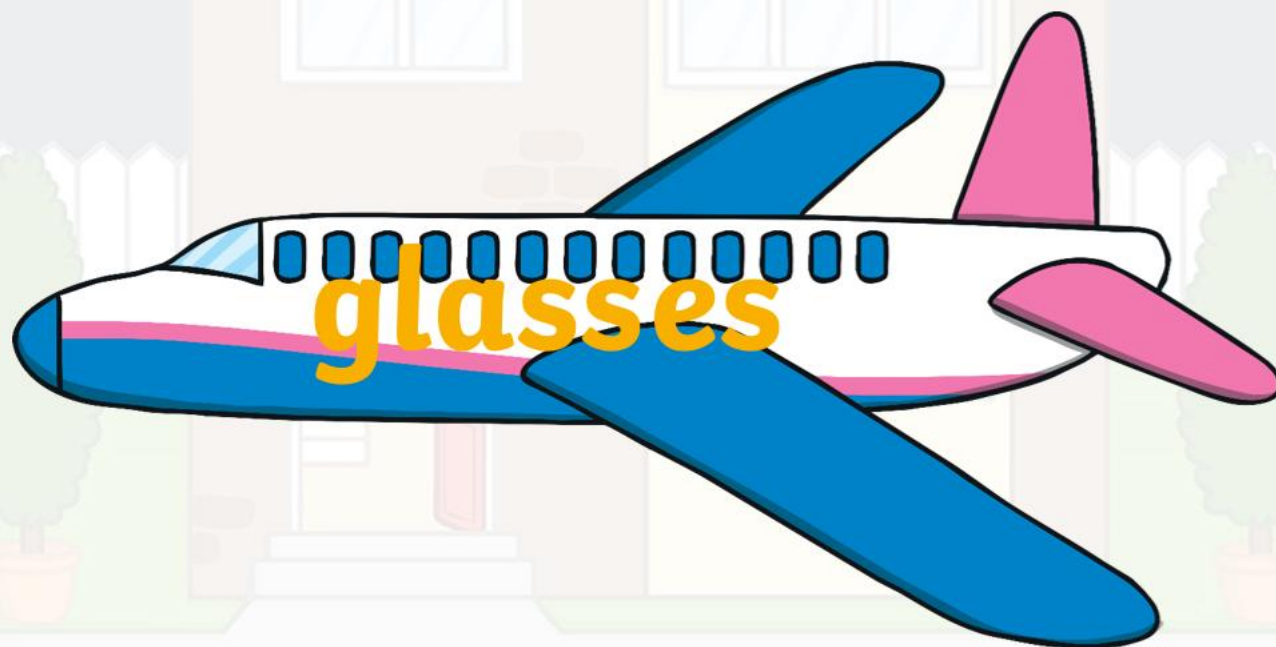


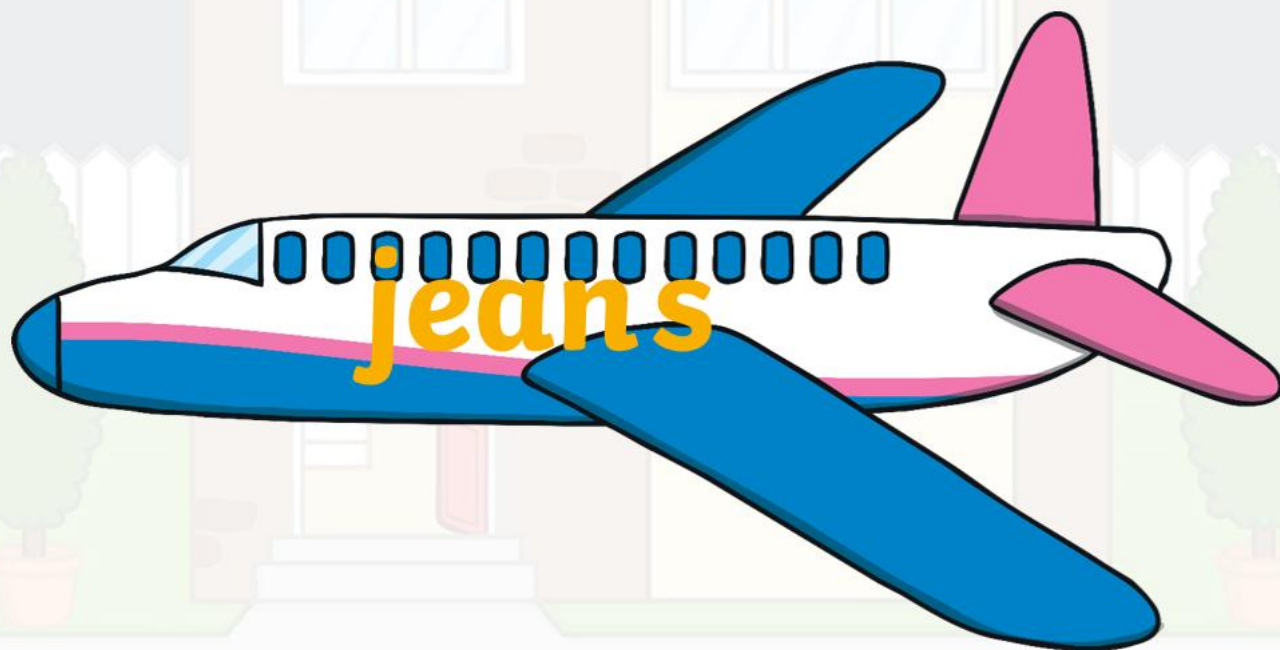
Some words sound like there is an extra beat or syllable, such as 'bushes' or 'dresses' which end in **-es**.





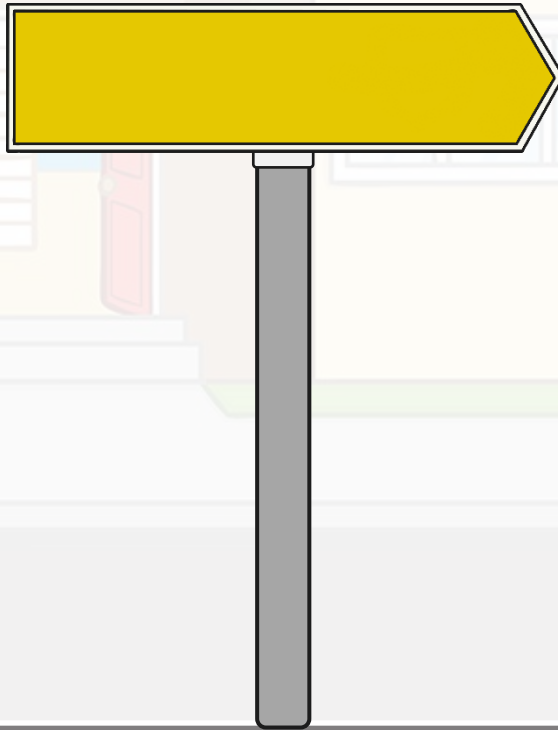




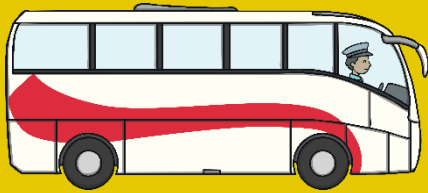


# -s or -es

The family finally arrive at Kanpur Airport. There are signs in lots of different languages! Read the words on the signs and decide if the word has the correct **-s** or **-es** ending.

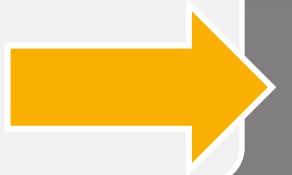


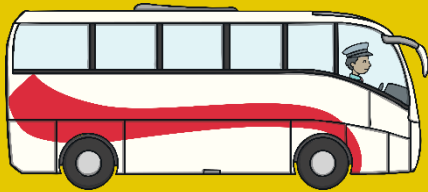
