#### **Developing**

- 1. A is can, B is should, C is will.
- 2 wil
- 3. She is incorrect. Using 'might' suggests that it is uncertain she will go. 'Will' suggests it is certain.

#### **Expected**

- 4. A is need, B is should or might, C is should or might.
- 5. used
- 6. She is incorrect. Using 'will' suggests that it is certain she will go. 'Must' suggests a need to go but not necessarily a certainty that they will go.

#### **Greater Depth**

- 7. A is could or might, B is ought, C is could or might.

- 9. He is correct. Using will instead of might will not affect the meaning of the sentence as the attendance at the party is still dependent on finding an outfit to wear.
