Penguins/Puffins Year 1



Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Warm up 5 mins every day - focus on quick recall of number bonds and fact families (6+4=10 so 4+6=10 and 10-6=4 and 10-4=6) as well as the x and \div facts for 10x table. Please continue to focus on this half term's KIRF (telling the time to o'clock and half past).


Daily lessons

If you can't access the BBC bitesize lessons you could try the following activities:

Monday

• Get a selection of objects e.g. marbles, pieces of pasta, counters and arrange them in to equal groups of 2, 5 and 10. How many groups have you got? How many objects have you got in total? Can you draw your equal groups in your book and write a sentence to go with it?



I have 4 equal groups of 5 counters so I have 20 counters in total.

Tuesday

 Have a look at the question below. Can you explain what Jamie has done wrong?

Weekly Writing Tasks (Letter Writing) (Aim to do 1 per day)

Monday- Create a word bank.

Look at the famous painting of The Great fire of London. Talk with an adult about what you see. What questions have you got about the painting? Make a list of questions and topic related words. Once you have made your word list, identify nouns, adjectives and verbs by colour coding the different word groups. Finish by looking at the power point on the Great Fire of London.

Tuesday- WALT: Make a timeline

Watch the PowerPoint on the Great Fire of London. Using the timeline template and picture prompts, create a timeline of events.

<u>Wednesday</u>- WALT: Sequence event in chronological order.

Look at the timeline you created yesterday. Verbally retell the events. Using the sequencing cards stick them in chronological order in your book and write a simple sentence for each. Use your word bank you created on Monday.

<u>Thursday</u>- WALT: Use adjectives, nouns and verbs.

Watch Year 2 children perform the Great Fire of London from Truro Prep School.

Can you imagine what the fire would sound like, smell like, look like and how would you feel?
Use the senses sheet to write down 2 or 3 simple sentences for each sense. Try to use an adjective and a verb. E.g. I can see red flames flickering.

<u>Friday</u>- WALT: Write a news report of the events.

Look at the PowerPoint on how to write a news report. Hopefully you will have read 2 of the news reports from your reading tasks. Now it's your turn. Can you write a report on The Great Fire of London? Use your timeline and word bank. Remember to include a heading. Use time conjunctions and days and times of when the events happened.

Please email your reports. We are looking forward

How many ways can you split this into equal groups?






