Today, we are learning to read words that contain **ea** saying /ee/.

The graphemes 'e', 'ee' and 'ea' are all used to spell the /ee/ phoneme in words such as 'be', 'bee' and 'bead'. There is not a consistent rule for when to use 'ee' or 'ea' so children will need to learn which grapheme to choose.

'Hello! I am your leader for today. Let's go and see the penguins.'

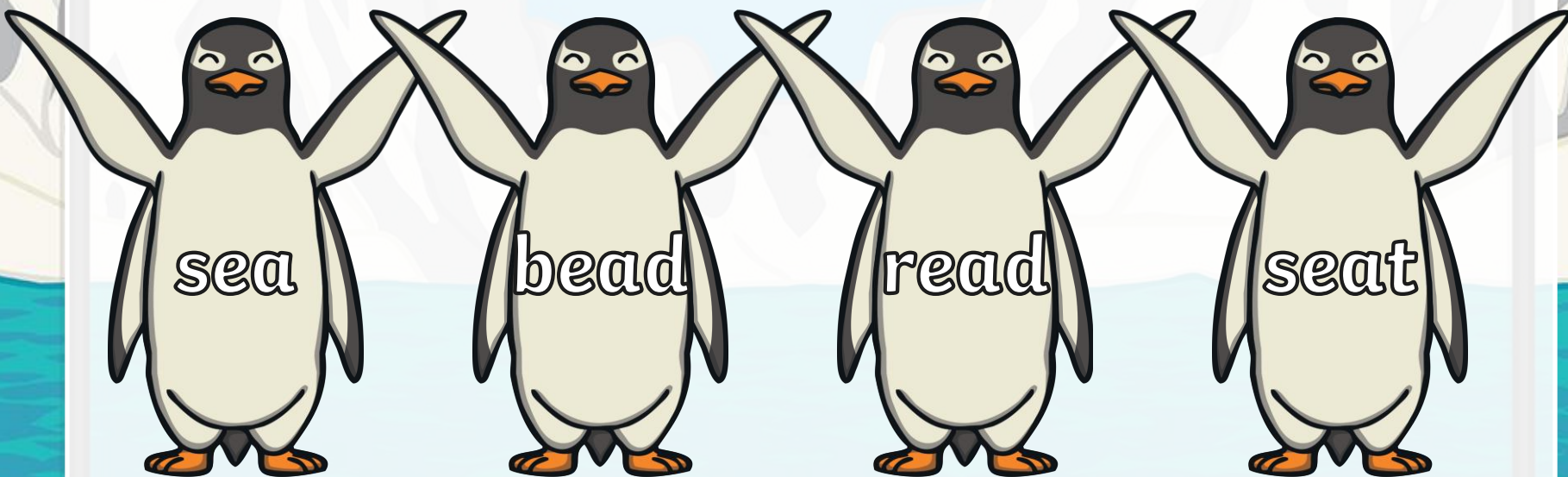


Sam turned to Kit and asked him, “Did you read about penguins in your book?”

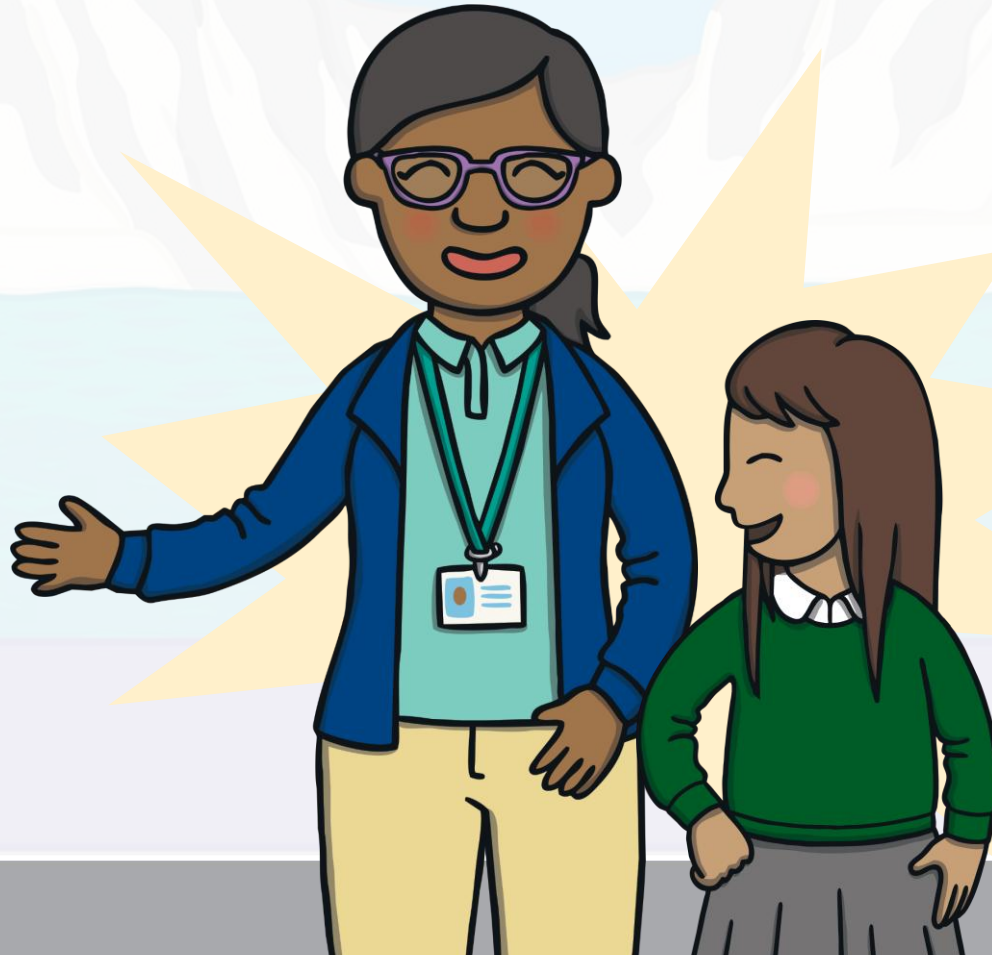
Mrs Pillay announced, "It is feeding time for the penguins. Gather around to have a closer look."
"What do they eat?" asked Sam.




As Sam spoke, one cheeky penguin brushed up against the glass. **Mr** Adams, who was stood nearby, jumped! It had given him a fright!

What did Mrs Pillay tell Sam? Read the sentence then click 'Show' to reveal the answer!



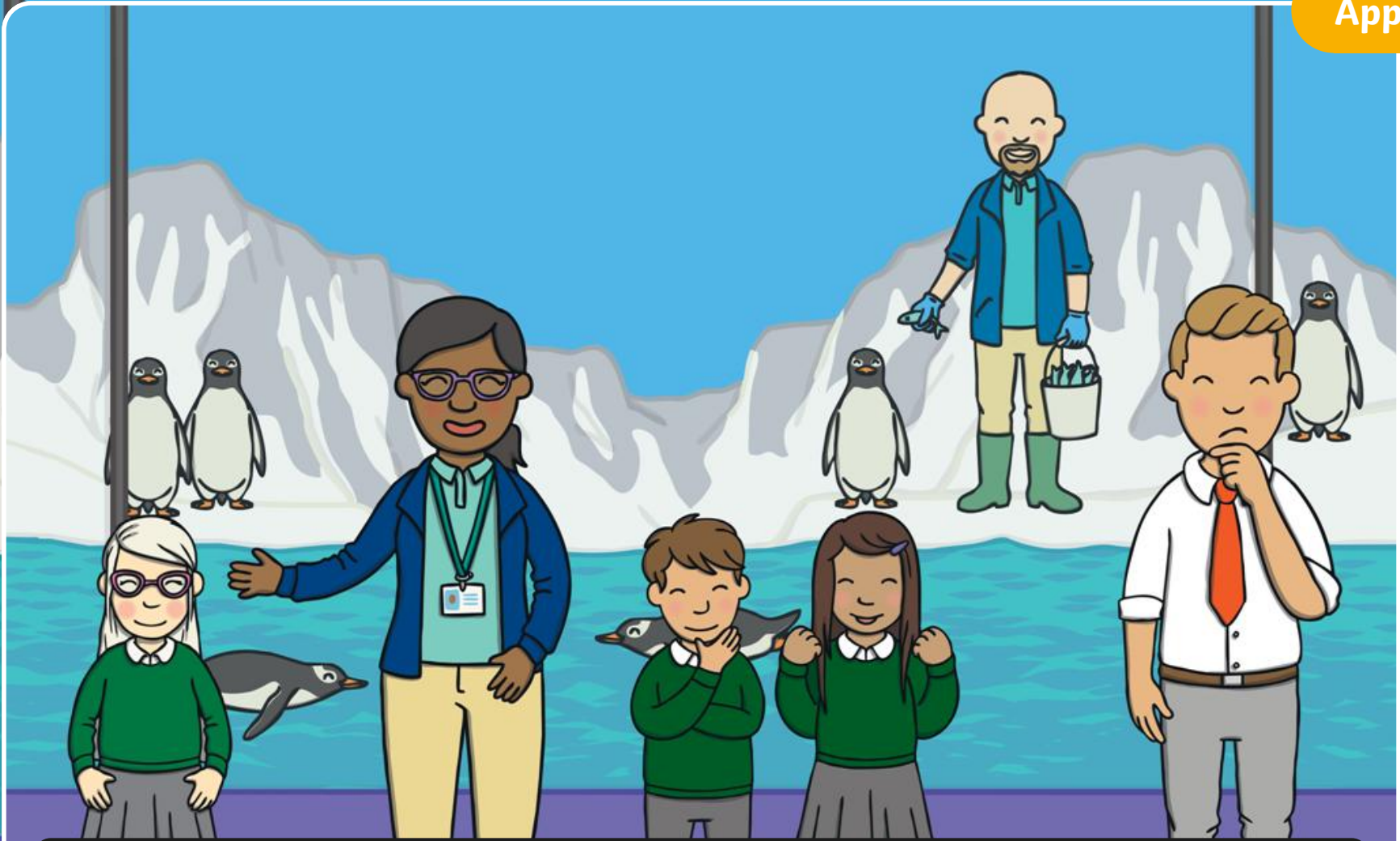


“They eat seafood, like fish

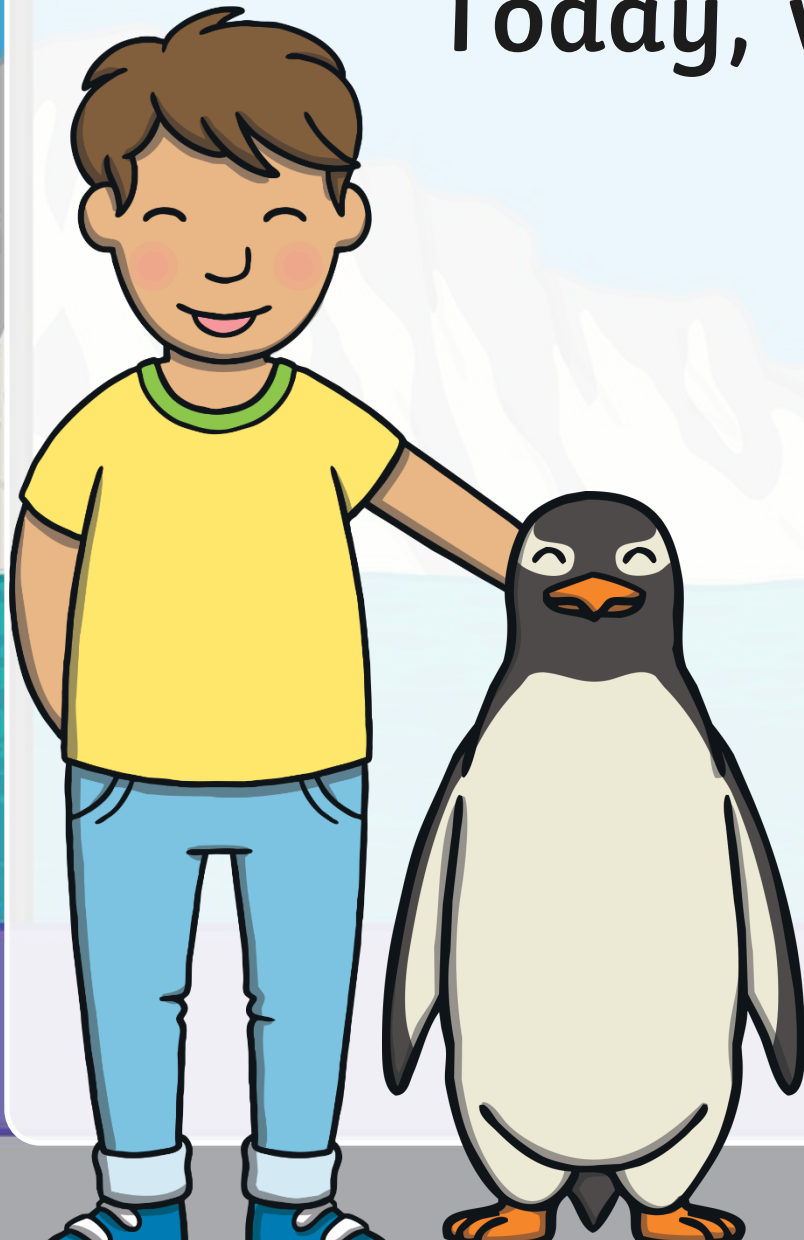
