



Day 1 - Animal Recipes

Day 2 - Discovering verbs and their tenses


Things you will need:

What to do:

- Choose two toys.
- · Hold a toy in each hand with your arms outstretched you be the balancel Guess which is heavier. Which arm needs to move up and which needs to move down?.
- Repeat with other pairs of toys.



Investigation Ten to the kilo

You will need:

- Objects weighing:

 - likg (e.g. a full bag of sugar) 1/2 kg (e.g. a 500ml bottle of water. A pack of butter is also close at 454g)
- A range of small household objects
- Feel the kilogram weight pass it between you so everyone can feel it. Be careful not to drop it!
- Feel the $\frac{1}{2}$ kg weight. This is half a kilo or 500 grams.
- Find exactly ten objects that weigh precisely one kilogram. You will need to weigh different things
 - to check out their weights. You will also need to use a lot of estimation!
- Discuss what sorts of things you can use. Try fairly heavy things like books or shoes or light things like socks or paintbrushes.
- When you think you have exactly 10 things that weigh exactly a kilogram ask an adult to check!

Day 4 - Read the poem Out of a Cloud by Richard Edwards.

- Which part of the poem gave it away to you?
- Now choose a colour and carefully underline all the nouns you find in My Step-Dad is an Alien.
- Use a different colour to underline all the adjectives.

Challenge

Can you find 10 things that weigh exactly 100 grams?


Things you will need:

- Jug of magic potion
- Funnel
- Washing up bowl
- · Range of containers (bottles and cups)



What to do:

- Choose two containers.
 Which do you think will hold more potion?
- Put the two containers in the washing up bowl to catch any spilled potion.
- Fill the bigger container with potion.
- Now pour the potion from the bigger container through the funnel into the small container. Is there room left or did it overflow? Which container holds more potion?
- Repeat with other pairs of containers.



S-t-r-e-t-c-h:

Choose two containers. Which do you think will hold most potion?

Fill an egg cup with potion. Pour the egg cup of potion into one container. Keep doing this until you know how many egg cups of potion it will hold.

Repeat for the other container.

Which container held most egg cups of potion?

Weekly Phonics/Spellings Tasks

(some of these can be repeated over the week)

This week's 'pattern' is adding the suffix '- ness' onto a root word to change it from an adjective to a noun. If the root word ends in a 'y', it changes to an 'i' before the suffix is added. Exception is 'argument'.

- Find some examples (choose feelings or characteristics) that use the spelling rule and write them down e.g. lazy. Then look at the spelling rule, change the last letter of the root word, and add -ness. How many can you find during the week?
- This week's common exception words are:

forwards backwards.

 Play Scattorgories - Choose a letter and all the players try and think of a word using the letter as the first letter. Try and see how many you can get in 5 mins. If you are the only person with that word you score 1 point. Play a couple of rounds using different first letters. Make sure the answers are all spelt correctly. (See questions on the next page)




Create a painting of lots of flying bees by printing them with your thumb print then add detail with a black pen once it's dry.
