Sometimes, **o** and **e** work as partners to make the /oa/ sound. Let's say these examples:

toe

goe

s

doe

This grapheme 'oe' makes the same sound as 'ow' as in 'low'.

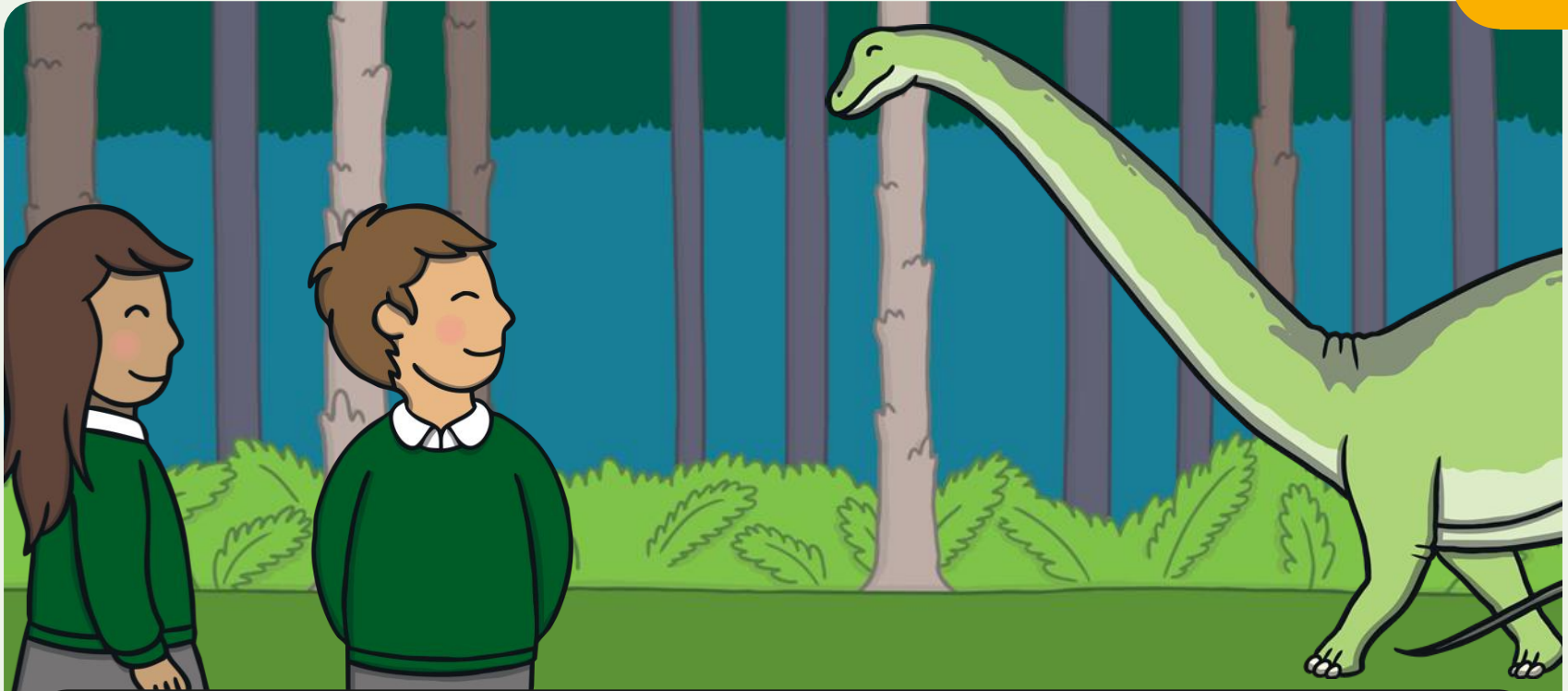

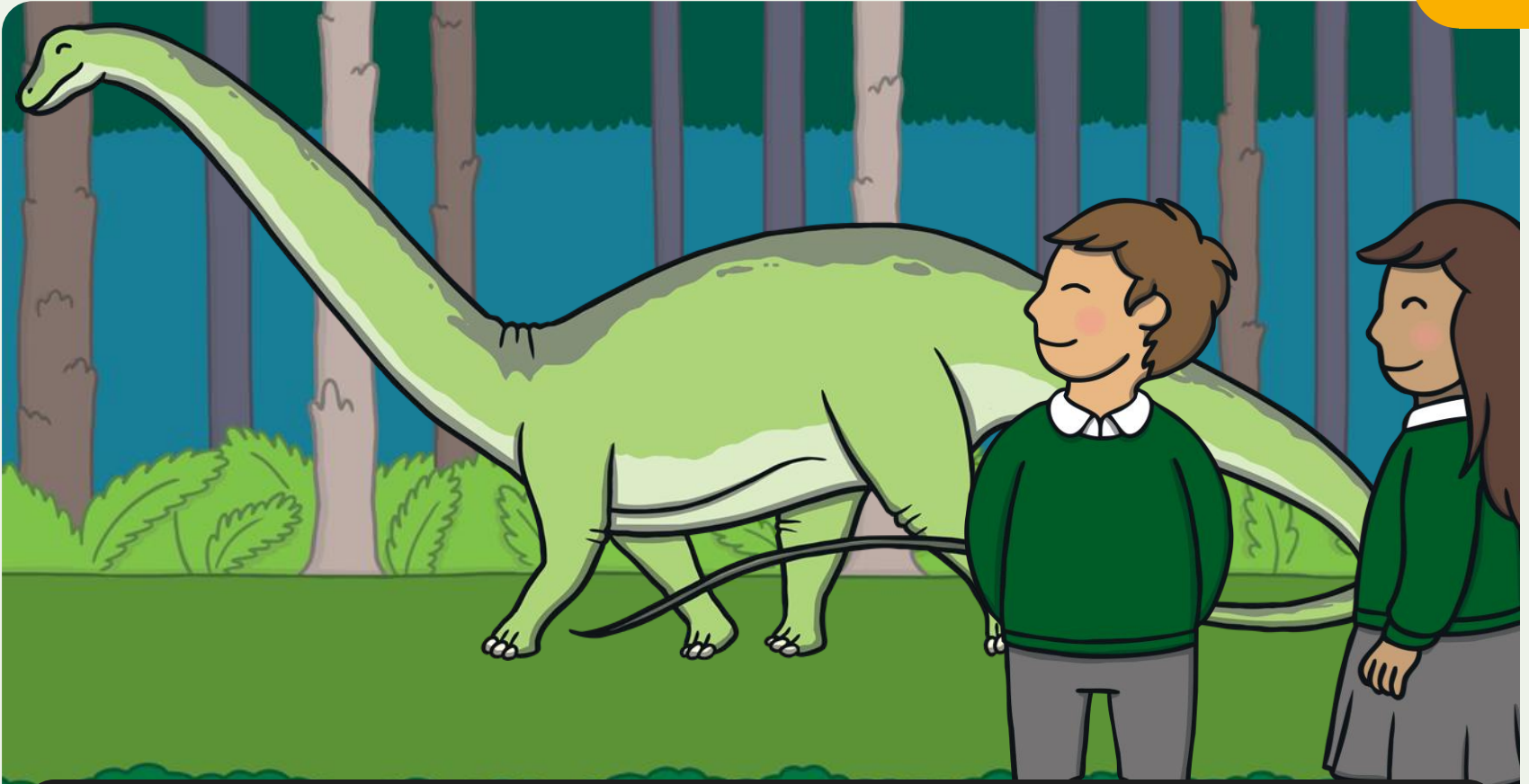
Kit and Sam were walking **through** the forest. They **thought** that they heard some elephants but soon realised it could not be! The sound was coming from a group of dinosaurs further up.



“Look!” said Kit to Sam. “There is an apatosaurus. It looks so **different** to Steg but it goes slowly like Steg does.”

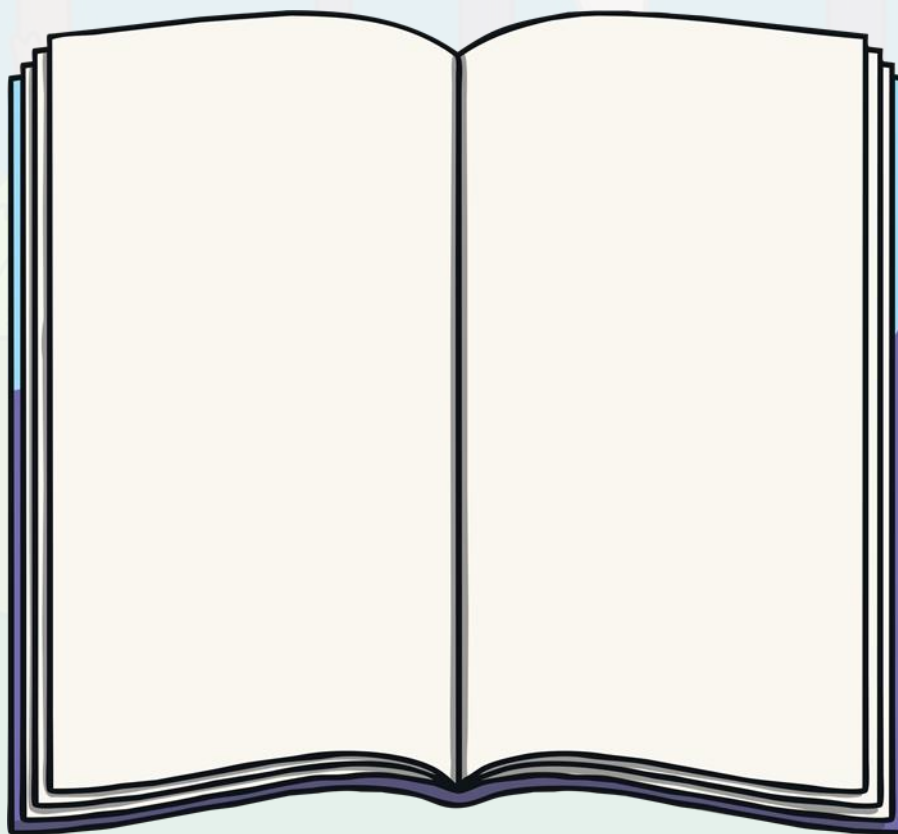
“It has funny toes! **Also**, a very long neck and a long tail,” said Sam.

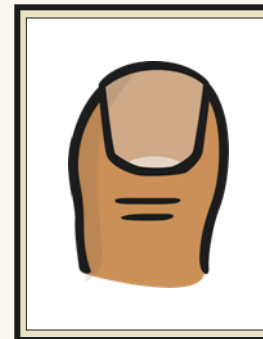

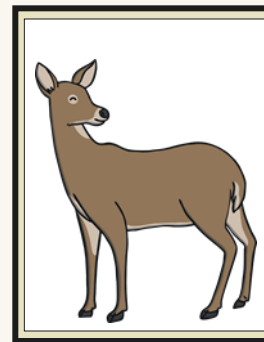

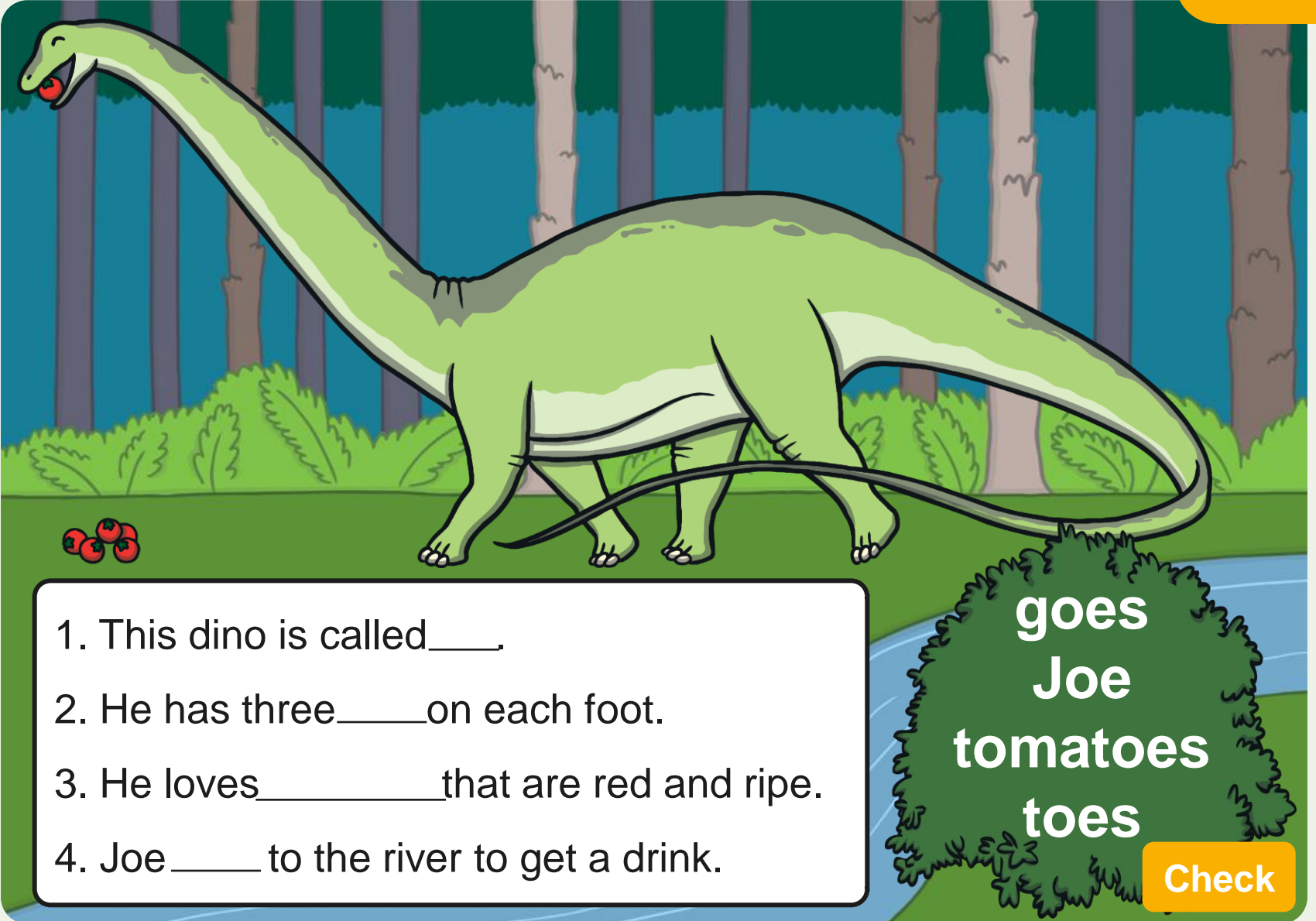
