



Plural Possessive Apostrophes with plural words

Note the apostrophe goes after the last letter unless the word is plural like women's. For example: women's toilets. The toilets belong to the women (there is more than one woman!)

girls' boys' babies' parents' teachers' women's men's

Different Forms




