English - a three-week unit of work on play scripts, focussing on Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet.

Maths - we are following the prescribed "Recovery Curriculum", which revises skills taught in year 5 before

moving on to year 6 expectations. Over the next two weeks the children will be working on long and short multiplication and short division.

Art - as part of our block of work on architecture the children will investigate how to use 2D perspective when drawing buildings.

RE - Considering the importance of "The Golden Rule" that is a common thread running

through many world religions.

Geography - exploring the geographical features of North America, recognising the difference between human and physical features.

Science - studying the different types of micro-organisms and the ways in which they can be helpful and harmful











School bags - since we are not using the cloakrooms at the moment, all the children's belongings are in the classroom with them at their places. With over 30 children in each class, space is very limited and it would help greatly if the bags that children bring with them are as small as possible.

Reading books - a reminder that every child should be bringing in a reading book from home to school every day.
