What will we be learning about in the next two weeks:

In **English**, starting Christmas stories using *Meerkat Christmas* by Kate Gravett. The focus is writing postcards to tell the story. We will also be carrying out the delayed Phonics Screening Check that children would normally have taken in Year 1.

In **Maths**, learning about money. We will be looking at coins and notes, adding amounts and finding change. *Please see below*.

In Art we will be exploring Christmas art.

In **Topic**, continuing our magical mapping topic looking at compass directions and orienteering.

In R.E. starting the unit 'What does the Christmas story tell Christians about Jesus.'

Spelling Patterns

27th November - the /l/ sound spelt '-le'. Spelling rule - there is no rule for this pattern but this is the most common spelling of the \l\ sound at the end of words.

4th December - the /l/ sound spelt 'el' at the end of words. Spelling pattern - whilst less common than '-le', the '-el' spelling is used after m, n, r, s, v, w and more often than not after s.

Just a reminder that it is intended that children should focus on these spelling patterns daily.
