

Welcome Back all of Year 3!

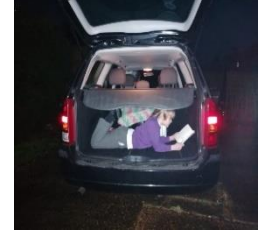
