WELCOME BACK

It has been so lovely to see all the children back this week. We would just like to say well done to all of Year 2 for coming back into school this week so well. After a long period of lockdown we have been very impressed by the maturity, enthusiasm and hard work shown be everyone this week which has enabled all to settle back into school life as quickly as possible.

What will we be learning about in the next two weeks:

In **English**, we are learning to write biographies using Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell is inspiration.

In Maths we will be completing our work on Shape and moving onto learning about Fractions.

In **Topic** our topic is 'Nurturing Nurses', and we are learning about what is means to be a significant person in History as well as the lives of three famous nurses (see above)

In **R.E.** we will be learning about the Easter story.

On Wednesday afternoons we will be continuing with our wellbeing sessions, giving the children a chance to work together and re-establish relationships with each other. Where possible we will hold these sessions out of doors.

World Book Day Tokens
