Maths - Statistics: interpreting and constructing line graphs and pie charts; finding out how to draw a circle accurately and describe its properties; calculating and using mean averages.

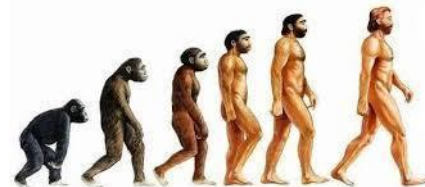
Science - continuing our topic on 'Inheritance and Evolution'.
