Channel relay swim for Bowel Cancer UK

At the end of July, 12 ladies, 2 of whom are North Downs mums, will attempt an English Channel relay swim to help raise awareness of the symptoms of bowel cancer and to raise funds for Bowel Cancer UK. Knowing the symptoms of Bowel Cancer can save lives and raising funds will help support the UK's leading Bowel Cancer charity to continue research and to support families.

This challenge has been 2 years in the making and this team's spirit has held strong despite closed pools and restrictions on travel to the sea. We will be wearing only a swimming costume, goggles and hat and will each swim for 1 hour at a time. We are drilled and ready to face the cold, the ferries and whatever the English Channel wants to throw at us.

Holiday Swimming

Come and join us for this fun and instructive course which will be running at the North Downs Primary School, Brockham site,

 26^{th} to 30^{th} July and 2^{nd} to 6^{th} August 2021.

The pool is 15 metres long and 5 metres wide with a constant depth of 1 metre. It is a perfect learner pool! There will be morning and evening sessions subject to demand.

All children from aged 3 plus are catered for in half hour sessions with teachers and assistants in the water. Children are encouraged to learn good water skills and develop their stroke technique as well as gaining in confidence and achieving distance badges where appropriate.

Children are split into groups by age and current swimming ability so that they work on skills suitable for their level of development. Maximum 4 in non-swimmer groups and maximum 5 in any group.

PRICE: The courses run for 5 days - some children come for the week and others may choose just 3 or more days. Fees are £8 per session attended. 1:1 and 2:1 sessions are available.
