PSHE Update from Mrs Boyer

Following on from our communications with you all last school year, here is a brief overview of progress made in light of the government statutory changes to Relationships Health Sex Education implemented by Summer 21. Please refer to the updated policy on our website.

History

With FONDS generous investment, we have taught Personal Social Health Education (PSHE)/Relationships Health Sex Education (RHSE) using JIGSAW since January 2020. After a period of consultation with parents, staff and governors, the overwhelming feedback was to embrace JIGSAW and teach sex education as part of PSHE.

What is JIGSAW?

JIGSAW is a spiral, comprehensive programme building on children's emotional literacy, self-esteem and knowledge of who they are and how they relate to each other and the world in a positive, healthy way. There are 6 topics to JIGSAW (outlined below) which change every half term. Each lesson consists of different elements such as mindfulness, games, group work and discussion.

- Being Me in My World
- Celebrating Difference
- Dreams and Goals
- Healthy Me
- Relationships
- Changing Me

JIGSAW amply covers the statutory parts of RHSE such as puberty and relationships taught in the summer term. There are a couple of lessons on sex education in the summer term affecting Y4, 5 and 6 within the 'Changing Me' unit. We will let you know in advance when these lessons take place and if you think you may not want your child to participate in these lessons, please contact your class teacher.
