Welcome to the first Learning Letter of the new school year!

We'll keep you informed of all the goings on in Year 4. Our topic for this term is Wind in the Willows.



Thanks to all who were able to attend *Meet the Teachers*. For those who were unable to be there we will include a few key points in this letter.

- Homework: will go out on a Friday and should be handed in by Wednesday of the following week.
- Diaries please record any reading in the diary. These will be checked regularly and signed each week.
- Expectations now that the children are in Y4, we expect them to arrive ready for the day ahead. Water bottles, diaries, homework and being ready to work on the EMA as they arrive in class.

River Walk: Thursday 22nd September As part of our Wind in the Willows topic, we will be going on a river walk to Poland wood. The children will be sketching a river scene. They will need a coat and either walking boots/shoes or wellies. They will also need a plastic bag to sit on.



PE kits should be in school all week. If they need their kit washed, it should be taken home on a Friday and returned on the Monday. Outdoor learning requires waterproof coat and trousers, wellies or walking boots - these should also be in school all of the time.

Reading books

Please ensure your child has a suitable (appropriate level / content) reading book in school. If necessary a book can be chosen from the shelves in the classrooms. Please ensure that you sign and date when your child has read at home.

Reminders:

Clubs: If your child is interested in joining a school club, please make sure that the forms are filled in, signed and returned to the school office.

Pencil cases: If your child has a pencil case, it must be kept in their bag or tray. School provides equipment required for lessons, however, on occasion, we do allow children to use their own pencils e.g. art/DT.
