Amazing fact...a child who hears 5 stories a day at 5 years old will have been exposed to over a million words!


We hope you are able to join us for our Reading Workshop on Tuesday 21st February at 2:15, at your respective school site.

Nest-boxes placed in gardens can make a real difference to the success or failure of a breeding species in an area, especially when accompanied by the regular supply of suitable food and water.
