BROCKHAM NATURE RESERVE Wildlife Garden Survey

Sorbus Learning CIC is a not-for-profit organisation, based in Brockham, that helps communities connect with nature. They are busy building the community garden at the moment but, they also have a new project for 2023 - Brockham Nature Reserve, working with residents and local organisations to make space for nature in village greenspaces to improve the biodiversity of community green spaces, recreation grounds, road verges and gardens.

A short garden survey is the start of their project, for our school and local community.
We have asked the children in Year 6 to complete

We have asked the children in Year 6 to complete the survey with their families- to look at what insects and birds you can see, and to record how your garden works for wildlife. We are linking this to the children's learning.
