



At this time of year, we are aware that there are many parents who are keen to help their children to have greater confidence in their schoolwork, so that they can deliver their best. This is not only in the run up to KS2 SATS, but also, to make the transition to secondary school as smooth as possible, by preparing their children to be ready to work well in their new setting. In response to this, we are keen to help and are planning to send home a selection of revision tasks to be undertaken over Easter. These will include:

- Arithmetic and general maths papers;
- Comprehension;
- Grammar and Punctuation, which the children have worked on in class.

The packs will be sent out in the last week of term. This work is not intended to be onerous but it is important in supporting their learning. In our experience, well-prepared children are considerably less likely to become stressed by the important summer term.

### Getting secondary ready.

In a further attempt to get the children prepared for their next step in September, we are encouraging independence. The children know that there will be an expectation of good presentation uniform and work! Also being prepared -correct kit and all stationery needed every day.
