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Welcome to the SEN/Pastoral Team newsletter from Mrs Scott, Mrs Hitch, Mrs Preston-Heard and Mrs Douglass.

We will still include dates for any updates for those who are on the SEN register e.g. when SEN passports are due to be sent home.

Transition preparations for new academic year 2023-24

With Summer term underway, we start to make preparations for our next academic year. Transition for our pupils is prepared for with a number of different events:

Moving up day for Year 6 will be on Tuesday 27th June, when they spend the day visiting their new secondary schools and meet their new class tutors, teachers and classmates. This is the same day for the two most local schools -The Ashcombe School and The Priory.

While Year 6 are out of school, pupils in current Years R - 5 spend the day time in their new classroom/site with their new teacher. Parents of current Year R at Betchworth are invited to visit the Leigh site. We also invite the parents of those children transferring to Brockham to a meeting at the Brockham site too.

Handover meetings - We have a number of different handover meetings in school in the Summer term so teachers can share information about additional needs and strategies to support as the children change classes or schools.

- Year 6 teachers meet Year 7 teachers from The Ashcombe and The Priory
- SENCO meets with The Ashcombe and The Priory SEN team (plus individual contact with others schools' SENCO for pupils with SEN)
- In school handover meetings for North Downs teachers
- Meetings with any schools from which children may be transferring to NDPS.
