#### Dear Parents, Carers and Children

This week's Newsletter is a bumper edition, and includes details of events and activities coming up. Next week is our Whole School Online Safety Week. Over the course of the week, year groups will be undertaking activities based on the theme 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online'.

We are incredibly fortunate that many of these activities and sessions are being delivered with the support of Dave Robinson, Computing for Schools Consultant. Dave has undertaken an online safety survey with the children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 which has included questions around the social media network sites our pupils use, how long they spend on these activities each week and asking them to reflect on how they feel when they are online and whether they follow online safety rules. Dave will use these responses to this survey as part of a Parents Session which he is running after school on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March at 3.15pm in the Hall at Brockham.

Teachers will supervise children in their classrooms at the end of the day to allow parents to attend. This parent session will address directly some of the issues which have been highlighted by the children themselves. Dave's sessions are always such good fun and highly informative - I have no doubt that every parent who comes along will find it so incredibly helpful. If you do decide to join us, one request from Dave - please bring your mobile phone with you. The session will last around half an hour to 45 minutes. If parents from our other sites would like to attend you would be very welcome - your child(ren) can go to their relevant year group classroom at the Brockham base. A huge thank you to FONDS for funding this week of online learning and activities for pupils, staff (and parents!).

Don't forget World Book Day next week too...children (and adults) are invited to dress as a book character on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, if they would to do so. I look forward to seeing you all on the gate!

We will also be adding some weekly skipping challenges for children to have a go at!


