Earrings must be removed for PE lessons NOT TAPED. No other school uniform is required on a PE day.


On other days, the children can choose to bring in a pair of trainers for outdoor activities to protect their school shoes as the weather changes!

## MATHS

Look for the Year 5 KIRFS (Key Instant Recall Facts) try to practise these daily alongside reading. Please tick in the column of the diary to show us that you have practised these. Initially we will concentrate on the Autumn 1 KIRF based on <u>Know multiplication &</u> <u>division facts for all times tables up to 12x12</u>

There will be weekly times tables tests - (personalised). We will continue to use Times Tables Rockstars

We will be following the new White Rose Maths Scheme which was revised and updated last year.



At home, it is expected that the children continue to spend time on the following activities:

**Times tables** - to help improve your child's confidence in Maths, it is extremely important that they learning the times tables so that they have <u>instant</u> recall of key times tables facts.

**Reading** - we expect the children to read EVERY night. <u>Please continue listening</u> to your child read and encourage him/her to take note of punctuation, read with expression and, most importantly, understand the meaning of the text.

**Spelling** - the children are provided with regular spelling lists. These are to be found in their school diaries. Testing takes place regularly.

**English / Topic and Mathematics** - this will be given out on a Thursday and should be handed in by the following Tuesday <u>at the latest</u>. Homework tasks are primarily a reflection of work covered in school and children should be able to work independently. Should your child have difficulty, you are warmly encouraged to offer help but kindly note this at the foot of the homework or in the school diary. This will allow us to follow this up at school.
