PE days -Monday and Wednesday- come in to school in your kit.


- No jewellery (unless studs that can be removed by your child)

Daily maths

- Maths try some everyday. We focus on Half termly Year 2 KIRFs or look at learning letter for ideas. These are also on the school website and in diaries.
- Weekly times tables tests start in Year 2. All children start with the 10s then move to 5s. There are 3 sheets (from the 5s) and the children have to score full marks before they move on. That way we ensure the facts are retained.
- Please support your child in correctly forming their numbers, these should all start at the top.

Daily spellings

- Spellings big focus in Year 2. Spelling patterns sent home every Friday alongside common Exception words for year 2. Stuck into diaries
- Spelling bingo grid every week in homework




