Welcome Back

Arrival in the morning is to remain staggered. Year 1 children to come in through the main entrance at 8.40am and must be in ready for registration at 9.00am

Drop off

- Please try to adhere to your child(ren)'s drop off times. These arrangements have been made to alleviate congestion outside the sites. We realise that for parents who are dropping at multiple sites this may not be possible but your understanding and cooperation with these arrangements are crucial.
- Siblings can be dropped off at the same. However, please use their designated gates for them to enter and exit by.
- Please drop off your children at the gates, rather than coming onto site in the mornings. If you have any messages to pass on a member of staff will be available outside every morning. Alternatively, please email the school office or class teachers directly. Contact details for all staff are on the school website.

- You must make contact with the office if your child is ill.

Illness

- Please inform the office as soon as you can when your child is ill - there is an answerphone on the main school number

What to bring in

Children will need to wear <u>school uniform</u> other than on days when they have PE. On these days we ask that the children come to school wearing their <u>PE kit/tracksuit bottoms/sweatshirt</u>.

Outdoor Learning and Forest School

Children should have their named wellies and (waterproofs) in school all of the time.

On Forest school days, children should come dressed in jogging bottoms and trainers and will then put on their outdoor clothing over the top.

A letter will go out to parents with groups and dates when Forest School starts.

Curriculum

We recognise that Key Stage 1 is different from the Foundation Stage and therefore we aim to manage the transition from Reception to Year 1 in a gradual, staged approach, which allows the children to adapt during the first half of the Autumn Term.

The focus for this term as well as ensuring a smooth transition will be to identify any gaps in the children's knowledge.

During the first term children will be introduced to whole class teaching and working in larger groups to complete set tasks.

They will have access to the Year 1 outdoor area/classroom where adult led and independent activities will be organised each day to consolidate learning done in class.

They will start to experience more whole class teaching for longer periods of time as the term progresses.

- Bug Club online book allocations will be updated at the end of each term to support reading over the holidays.


Maths

Year 1 - Autumn 1 I can <u>subitise</u> to 10

Subitising is saying how many you see without counting.



Practical Activities

Here are some activities that you can try at home to develop your child's subitising skills:

- Quickly reveal small quantities of objects under a series of pots. The children must 'splat' the matching dot pattern or number plate with their hand or a fly swatter as fast as they can.
- Using fingers to <u>subitize</u> numbers. Play in pairs, one person calls numbers the other shows fingers then reverse (show fingers then call number)
- Use dice and 'say what you see' (cover quickly so children subitise not count)

Children will earn house points for good work, behaviour, attitude and helpfulness.

They will also be rewarded with stickers and gold stickers in books for good work.

In addition we have a handwriting King or Queen crowned weekly for careful work.

Certificate assembly is on Thursdays for Key stage 1.

This is when children have the opportunity to share with Year 1

and 2 any rewards, medals and certificates they may have been awarded in or outside school. We ask that these be recent awards.

Teachers will be awarding 2 people each week for a certificate for good work and behaviour in class.

A rainbow ticket will be awarded each day to someone who has shown real kindness and respect to adults and peers.

Homework

- Homework will start after the autumn term; this will be assigned in a homework book.
- Reading and KIRFS every day
- Common Exception words to be learnt each week. There will be four a week stuck in homework books.
- Homework every Thursday due the following week, Wednesday. Could be English, Maths or Science/Topic based
