Welcome Back

Arrival in the morning is to remain staggered. Year 1 children to come in through the side entrance at 8.40am and must be in ready for registration at 9.00am

Drop off

- Please try to adhere to your child(ren)'s drop off times. These arrangements have been made to alleviate congestion outside the sites. We realise that for parents who are dropping at multiple sites this may not be possible but your understanding and cooperation with these arrangements are crucial.
- Siblings can be dropped off at the same. However, please use their designated gates for them to enter and exit by.
- Please drop off your children at the door, rather than coming into the site in the mornings. If you have any messages to pass on a member of staff will be available outside every morning. Alternatively, please email the school office or class teachers directly. Contact details for all staff are on the school website.

What to bring in

Children will need to wear <u>school uniform</u> other than on days when they have PE. On these days we ask that the children come to school wearing their <u>PE kit/tracksuit bottoms/sweatshirt</u>.

Outdoor Learning and Forest School

Curriculum

We recognise that Key Stage 1 is different from the Foundation Stage and therefore we aim to manage the transition from Reception to Year 1 in a gradual, staged approach, which allows the children to adapt during the first half of the Autumn Term.

The focus for this term as well as ensuring a smooth transition will be to identify any gaps in the children's knowledge.

During the first term children will be introduced to whole class teaching and working in larger groups to complete set tasks.

They will have access to the Year 1 outdoor area/classroom where adult led and independent activities will be organised each day to consolidate learning done in class.


They will start to experience more whole class teaching for longer periods of time as the term progresses.

Homework - Reading

- Reading tips (See diary)
- Reading for understanding
- Quality rather than quantity
- If possible read every night
- Diaries signed and dated; we ask just that the title and the date to be written down.
- There is an additional column for KIRFs. Please can you just initial when your child has practised this.
- Please ensure that diaries are in school every day.
- New books Monday, Wednesday (Bug Club) and Friday (Oxford reading tree).
- Bug Club online book allocations will be updates at the end of each term to support reading over the holidays.

Maths


- 1) KIRFs (all on the website) looking for daily maths practise to go alongside daily reading.

Subitising is saying how many you see without counting.



Practical Activities

Here are some activities that you can try at home to develop your child's subitising skills:

- Quickly reveal small quantities of objects under a series of pots. The children must 'splat' the matching dot pattern or number plate with their hand or a fly swatter as fast as they can.
- Using fingers to <u>subitise</u> numbers. Play in pairs, one person calls numbers the other shows fingers then reverse (show fingers then call number)
- Use dice and 'say what you see' (cover quickly so children subitise not count)


