Welcome back to the beginning of new school year. The children are already settling into their very important position as the 'oldest' in the school. Year 6 is always a great experience, as the children can really shine, ready for their next step in education.

The children are already well underway in many areas of study...

<u>English:</u> -studying the structure and elements of a 'Mystery Story'. Our chosen text is 'Holes' by Louis Sacher. Set in the deserts of Texas, the story perfectly complements our Geography topic.

<u>Maths:</u> - consolidation of understanding of Number & Place Value. We then move onto the four number operations.

<u>Science:</u> - the classification of living things. <u>Geography:</u> - looking at the continent of North America.

<u>Art:</u> - beginning a unit on turning 2D drawing into 3D modelling.

<u>Spellings:</u> - examples will be sent home fortnightly to learn; there is regular practise available on Spellzone, for which the children all have logins and we can monitor their diligence.

At first we have set a spelling ability test for the children to complete.

<u>Punctuation and Grammar</u> The children will bring home a comprehensive guide - 'SPAG Mat' to support their learning at home.

Spellzone & Times Tables Rockstars

In addition to the maths and English homework, we will also be setting **Spellzone** for each half term. These can be completed at **ANY TIME** during the half term so there is no expectation for tasks to be completed each week.

Children can also access **TT Rock Stars** to keep practising their tables. Even a quick 'Studio' game a couple of times a week can help to keep the tables facts fresh.

Keen to develop an enthusiasm for reading, we are pleased to offer a borrowing facility for Year 6 library books.



Children may bring home a book for the Year 6 library. May we please ask that all books are returned once finished.
