Stationery - Children need to bring a handwriting pen (not biros) into school every day. These can be either blue or black. A <u>small</u> pencil case is permissible, in addition they can keep additional colouring pens/pencils in a pencil case, to be kept in their bags or tray. No toys are allowed in class or on the playground unless we have allowed one fidget toy for your child to use in the classroom.

Clothing - we have certainly noticed it getting a little bit chillier in the last couple of weeks. It is essential that children have a separate set of warm outdoor clothes and footwear for outdoor lessons. Sturdy shoes/wellies are required, and if the children wish to use tools outside, they need to bring their own gloves please. PE kit should only be worn in on a PE day (Tuesday). If attending an after-school club, we ask that the children bring their kit in and change at the end of the day.
