Message from Surrey Wildlife Action for Nature - 'What can you do for nature?'

Surrey's wildlife is in decline, but by taking some simple actions at home, we can all help create a Nature Recovery Network across the county.

Action for Nature - Make a Splash! Ponds can be home to an interesting range of wildlife, and even a small one made from a suitable container can attract animals including damsel and dragonflies, frogs and newts. Any pond can become a feeding ground for birds, hedgehogs and bats - the best natural garden pest controllers - and your pond needn't be big.

A washing-up bowl, a large plant pot, or a disused sink could all be repurposed as ponds, providing you make sure creatures can get in and out If you don't have your own outdoor space at home, why not <u>help</u> <u>the environment by watching what you wash away</u>? Some of our favourite washing-up liquids and cleaning products can be harmful to wildlife with long-lasting effects. Brands like Ecover, Method, Bio-D and some supermarket own-brands have good products made from natural and environmentally friendly ingredients. Using eco-friendly detergents in your clothes wash is also a great way to watch what you're putting into rivers and seas, keeping water clean for wildlife."
