With the arrival of colder winter weather, our garden birds need all the help they can get.

Attracting birds to your garden is easy:

supplement naturally available food with bird food and watch them flock in! Remember to keep feeders and tables clean, so the birds stay healthy and disease-free, and position your feeders in a relatively open area away from predators - the birds will feel safer and visit more! Make sure food (and water!) is available at all times, as birds have different needs throughout the year.

If you don't have your own outdoor space at home, why not <u>aim for a more sustainable Christmas?</u>

Avoid throwaway plastic, go homemade, and keep wildlife in mind. It'll add a sweet personal touch that'll mean the world to someone this festive season!
