Iron Man Materials

During the last week of this half term, we will be making Iron Man sculptures. We would like the children to start collecting materials for their sculpture. Everyone will need sufficient kitchen foil in order to cover their sculpture completely. The finished figures will be approximately 40cm tall. In addition, they will need some of the following: a variety of small cardboard boxes, cardboard tubes, lids, bottle tops and possibly some tiny metal items such as nails, screws, bolts, washers, paperclips, old wires, old electronic parts or pipe cleaners.

Reading Adventures!

Further to last week's 'Reading Adventure' launch, some children are having a go at reading a new type of book to broaden their reading diet. Some of the classic books are proving quite tricky - so we would like to say a huge 'well done' to those children. Spelling Focus

This week, we are learning that the letters 'ch' can make both a /k/ and /ch/ sound. If 'ch' is in the middle of a word it is usually pronounced /k/. If 'ch' is at the end of a word it can be pronounced /ch/ or /k/. When the letters 'ch' make a /k/ sound, the word is usually Greek in origin.

We are learning these in class:

ache, character, chorus, monarch, stomach, anchor, chasm, echo, orchestra, technology, chaos, chemist, mechanic, scheme
