For homework we would like you to make a 3D model of a Mayan home

The picture above shows the structure of the house - the wooden poles used to make the walls and roof.

The base of your model should be no bigger than A4 paper size - 21x29cm.

You could use rolled up newspaper tubes or paper straws for the structure to make the walls and roof or even pieces of wooden dowel.
