In the last two weeks we have...

- Used mathematical language 'more, greater, less and fewer' when comparing numbers
- Continued learning phase 3 letters and sounds and tricky word
- Used the stories of Jack and The Beanstalk and Jasper's Beanstalk as a focus for our learning
- Introduced our new Jigsaw topic 'healthy me'

Over the next two weeks we will...

- Tell the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff, and Cinderella
- Observe changes, as our seeds germinate.
- Develop our subitising skills (saying what we see without counting), working with numbers to 8 and investigate number composition to 10
- Discuss healthy eating choices through our Jigsaw programme
- Observe changes in trees and plants as spring progresses.
