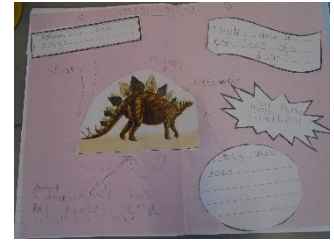




The children have created some fantastic posters on Dinosaurs. They have learnt how posters need to be eye catching, full of pictures, information text boxes, labels and a bold title.

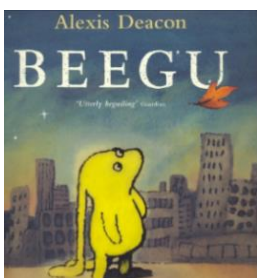


### What we are learning

- English - Narrative writing/persuasive letter writing around the theme of Beegu.
- Phonics Phase 5; c (ck, ch, c).
- Maths - Addition and Subtraction within 20.
- Science - Investigating uses for different materials.
- Geography - Looking at the local area.
- RE - Learning about Judaism and the importance of the Torah scroll.
- Art - Exploring printing and pattern.
- Computing - Using Purple Mash.
- Gymnastics - linking travel and shape.
- Games - Ball control.
